Dear Friends,

This has been a tough year for many Tanzanians. The rains have failed and much of the country is in drought. This affects not only farmers, but also towns such as Morogoro as the nation's hydropower has been unable to meet electricity demands. With power shortages in some areas up to 12 hours for 3-5 days in a row, factories are shutting down, and productivity at all levels of society has almost slowed to a halt. Thank goodness for Solar Power! Never has our status as a totally solar-operated school been more appropriate or made us happier. As long as the sun continues to shine, the Segga School continues to get electricity. The 22 panels donated by Suntech in 2010, and Deka batteries from East Penn Mfg, power our water pump, lights, and 7 new energy efficient computers donated by For Girls Sake. Our students learn about solar energy in physics class and have their own school as the living example of what being energy efficient means. Thank you Suntech, Deka/ East Penn Mfg & For Girls Sake!

80% of Segga's non formal students passed the Tanzanian mandated Standard VII national exam in 2010, compared with 50% nationally! This year, our Form II students will be sitting for the Form II national exam, a big milestone for all of them and for Segga. We insist they turn out the lights at 10pm each night, as they are so driven that they try to stay up all night preparing for their exams!

Student Highlight - Vaselista Njozi



I am 14 years old living at the Mission to the Homeless Children. There are more than 32 kids living there. I was living with my parents in Songea but then they both passed away. I was taken to live with my grandparents who later also passed away. My brother took me in but his finances were bad so he took me to an orphanage where they introduced me to Segga. Not everyone gets a chance like me and I promise to study hard to reach my goals. I like the environment at Segga because there are gardens and trees and enough books and desks for each student.

My favorite sport is netball. My goal is to become a teacher because most people become poor due to lack of education. I want to help vulnerable children who need support to make their life better through education.
